Any assignment change will be noted in the judging program and provided to all competitors.  
Judging schedule will be sent to exhibitors after closing.

## DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

An entry is defined as a single run by a single dog in a single class.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, or fax. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed to Lauren Beyer at [sw@BlueSkye.net](mailto:sw@BlueSkye.net). No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

**Illegible entries** will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$30.00 bank service charge fee to the amount of each returned check.

## STAGING AREA AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

**Staging Area** will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include a warm-up and waiting area, as well as a table for check-ins and posting of trial information and results.

**Handler Briefing** will be an individual briefing at the search area. The judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. Detective will have a group briefing posted in the schedule. NO DOGS are to be present during the Detective Handler's Briefing.

**Warm-up area** will be available in the staging area consisting of ONE container of Birch, Anise, Clove, and Cypress, as appropriate, and may include additional blank containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

## SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

**Search Area Conditions:** Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class. These trials will be held in a large, covered, open sided structure. The location is ADA accessible. The surface is paved but not smooth; some irregularities exist.

**Search Area:** Sizes will be as follows: Container Novice (250-400 sqft), Advanced (400-600 sqft), Excellent (600-800 sqft), Master (600-800 sqft); Buried Novice (150-200 sqft), Advanced (150-200 sqft), Excellent (200-300 sqft), Master (400-50 sqft).

## ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

**Trial Site.** It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

ONLY DOGS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE to be shown under The American Kennel Club rules shall be allowed within the show precincts.

**Possession of Odors and Training.** Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

**Crating.** Plan to crate from/next to your vehicle. There is no shade, come prepared with shade covers, fans, and water. Pop-ups (which must be weighted down – absolutely **no staking** into the ground due to electrical) are allowed. Vehicles should not be left running. Crates should not be left overnight outdoors. The Puyallup Valley Dog Fanciers and the Washington State Fairgrounds will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

**Spectator Area.** Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be ask to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

## MOVE-UP TRANSFERS

Move-up transfers are within the same element only. Requests must be in writing and must also include the dog's call name and AKC number.

Pre-trial move-up requests must be in writing and received by the trial secretary by 6:00 pm on Monday, June 29, 2026. Please send an email to: [sw@BlueSkye.net](mailto:sw@BlueSkye.net) – preferably reply to your confirmation email so I have your dog entry information for easy reference.

Move-ups between trial days must be received no more than 30 minutes after the last run of the day and must be in writing on the move-up form provided at the trial or via email.

Requests must be on the AKC transfer form ([http://images.akc.org/pdf/events/Scent\\_Work\\_Transfer\\_Form.pdf](http://images.akc.org/pdf/events/Scent_Work_Transfer_Form.pdf)) – the trial secretary will have blank forms at the trial site. Requests via email to [sw@BlueSkye.net](mailto:sw@BlueSkye.net) are acceptable or use the [Online Move-Up Form](#). If emailed, you must include the dog's Call Name, Owner Name, and AKC Number. No other way of requesting a move-up will be accepted.

All exhibitors should obtain a copy of the current Regulations for Scent Work Trials by downloading them from the American Kennel Club website.

## RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place .....	Blue
Second Place .....	Red
Third Place .....	Yellow
Fourth Place .....	White
Qualifying Score.....	Dark Green
Detective Qualifying Score .....	Dark Green Rosette
New Element Title .....	Bright Yellow
New Elite Title or New Level Title.....	Red/White/Blue Rosette

*(in conjunction with our 250th Independence Day Celebration, New Title Rosettes will be Red, White, and Blue)*

### **High In Trial**

*High In Trial will be awarded each day for all levels*

Teams who participate in all elements offered (Containers, Interior, Exterior, Buried) at the same level, and qualify in each, are eligible to win High in Trial. One High In Trial winner for each level will be awarded. Novice A and Novice B are considered one level.

The High In Trial is determined by adding the teams' faults across the elements. The team with the fewest faults in each level will be declared High In Trial for each level. If there is a tie based on faults, then each teams' times across the elements will be summed and the fastest-finishing team will win. If there is a tie after considering both faults and time, a coin-flip will determine the High In Trial.

*Teams winning High In Trial will be awarded a rosette.*

### **High Combined Division**

*High Combined Division will be awarded each day for all levels*

Teams who participate in all elements offered (Containers, Interior, Exterior, Buried) at the same level, plus Handler Discrimination for that level, and qualify in all, are eligible to win High Combined Division. One High Combined Division winner for each level will be awarded. Novice A and Novice B are considered one level.

The High Combined Division is determined by adding each teams' faults across all classes. The team with the fewest faults in each level will be declared the winner of the High Combined Division for each level. If there is a tie based on faults, then each teams' times across the classes will be summed and the fastest-finishing team will win. If there is a tie after considering both faults and time, a coin-flip will determine the winner.

*Teams winning High Combined Division will be awarded a rosette.*

### **Scent Work Detective Title**

The Scent Work Detective (SWD) title will be granted when ten (10) qualifying scores are earned in the Scent Work Detective class.

*Teams earning a Scent Work Detective Title will receive a rosette.*

**Awards are available for each trial the day you achieve it and must be claimed by the Exhibitor the day it is earned.**

## TRIAL SPECIFIC INFORMATION

**EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN:** Check-in using Secreterrier, the gate steward can assist you, if needed. If you do not intend to run in a class, please mark your dog as absent.

**\*\*\* Please mark conflicts, we will do our best to accommodate them. \*\*\***

**Awards:** Qualifying ribbons will be awarded as you leave the search area. Placement ribbons and New Element Title ribbons will be available near where the preliminary results are posted. New Elite Title rosettes, New Level Title rosettes, and Detective Title rosettes will be available at the secretary's table. Novice and Advanced HIT and HCD will be awarded after lunch, before Excellent starts. Excellent and Master HIT and HCD will be awarded shortly after judging ends for the day.

**Posting of Preliminary Results:** The preliminary results from each class shall be posted at the trial location, as soon as is feasible after the conclusion of the class. Results will be made available on the web at [sw.BlueSkye.net](http://sw.BlueSkye.net) and emailed to each exhibitor at the end of the weekend.

**Exhibitors are responsible** for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

**Setup:** Setup for the trial will be done Thursday afternoon, July 2<sup>nd</sup>. If you are available to assist with any of the following, please fill out the [volunteer form](#) to be notified of the details.

- Assemble boxes
- Fill buried containers with sand/water
- Assist with tarping/pop up placement
- Unload equipment

## VOLUNTEERS

A successful trial depends on the help of its volunteers! There will be an [online volunteer form](#) available for you to sign-up in advance to allow you to get your preference of jobs and coordinate with your run. Don't worry if you don't know what to do – we will happily train you!

### Job Descriptions

*Note: many volunteer positions require walking/standing/bending. \*Sit down jobs available.*

- **Element Setup** – Assist in the setup for assigned element, at the judge's direction, including line-of-site, start lines, boundary marking.
- **Clean Up** – Clean up of search areas after last runs and site preparation for the next day, removal and loading of all trial gear at trial's completion.
- **\*Judge's Steward/Timer** – Bring competitors to the start line, remind them of the time limit and leash options for the search, time competitor runs.
- **\*Gate Steward** – Manage the competitor line/flow for the trial element area, using the run order app, guiding competitor positioning while waiting for their turn.
- **Hide Steward (includes Hot Box Steward)** *must wear latex or nitrile gloves when handling odor containers/boxes, etc. to prevent contamination* – Handles and places hides for those classes the judge requires a hide steward, including moving or adjusting hides during a class *at the judge's direction*. Handles/sets warm-up boxes. Clean up between buried hide competitors may be required, including sweeping, vacuuming, or returning spilled soil or sand to the container.
- **Score Runner** – Carries score sheets from search areas to score table throughout the trial.
- **Registration** – Check-in of arriving competitors and volunteers. Assistance at score table with various tasks including putting score sheets in order, checking preliminary results, etc.

## NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

### SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

**The safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Puyallup Valley Dog Fanciers and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Puyallup Valley Dog Fanciers reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Puyallup Valley Dog Fanciers or any official thereof.

**Collars, Leashes and Harnesses.** During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

**All dogs must be on leash** at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used on show grounds. Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

### REFUNDS

**No entry fee** will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

**Bitches in season** will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

NO DOGS wrongly entered in a class may be transferred to another class, unless specifically allowed for in AKC Rules & Regulations.

OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE for errors in entry forms, regardless of who may make such errors. Please carefully review your confirmations!

### RINGSIDE

**Judges are not required** to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

**Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.**

"Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations." Additionally, clubs should include any specific local or state health requirements; for example, proof of rabies vaccination.

**Fast CATs** will be to the west of Fairview Drive. Exhibitors can park in the Green (Fair-Time) Lot to the west side of the road.

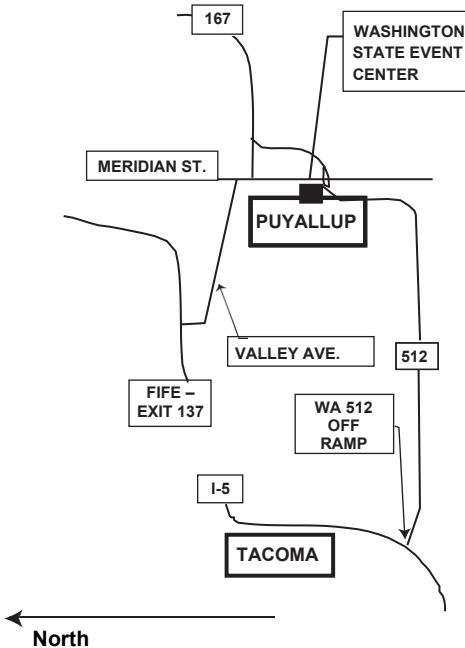
### **General Day Parking: \$10.00 per day or 3-Day Parking Pass for \$25.00**

### ROUTES TO FAIRGROUNDS

#### FROM BELLEVUE AND THE EASTSIDE:

Take I-90 to I-405 South. Take Exit 2 to Hwy 167 towards Kent/Auburn. Travel South on Hwy 167 for approximately 20.2 miles to Hwy 161 South/Hwy 512 W. Travel 2.3 miles to the second exit, Meridian St S. At the light at the end of the exit turn left. Pass under the highway, and Turn right onto 15<sup>th</sup> Ave SW. Turn right onto Fairview Dr. Turn right into Green Lot.

#### FROM SEATAC AIRPORT:

*Option 1:* Depart airport, taking exit to I-5 and I-405. Follow signs to I-405 Northbound toward Renton and Bellevue. Take Exit 2, Hwy 167 So. Toward Kent/Auburn. Travel south on Hwy. 167 20.2 miles to 161 South/512 West. Follow Hwy 512 West to Puyallup and Olympia. Traveling 2.3 miles. Take the second exit, Meridian St S. At the light at the end of the exit turn left. Pass under the highway, and Turn right onto 15<sup>th</sup> Ave SW. Turn right onto Fairview Dr. Turn right into Green Lot.

*Option 2:* Take I-5 south to the Puyallup Exit 142B in Federal Way. As exiting, stay in the left lane. Turn right at the traffic light at the end of the exit ramp, then turn left at the first traffic light onto Hwy 161. Travel approximately eight miles into Puyallup Valley.
